Date: -24/01/2024

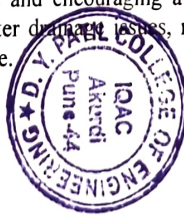
### > Objectives of Camp Day 3:

All volunteers woke up early at 4:30 a.m. All gathered at the school premises at 5:30, and then the volunteers arranged morning activities like a warmup, stretching, running and YogaSan (Bhramari Pranayama, Nadi Shodhan, Om Chanting, etc.). After breakfast and attendance at 9 AM we had a meeting regarding the activity for the day which included Village cleaning activity Soak pit construction activity, activity for village womens

Main activities were Soak pit creation and village cleaning activities. The primary objective of the Village Cleaning Drive was to promote cleanliness, hygiene, and community involvement in rural areas. This initiative aimed to create awareness about the importance of maintaining a clean environment for the overall well-being of the village residents. The cleaning drive incorporated waste segregation practices, educating participants about the proper disposal of different types of waste to promote environmental sustainability. Village Cleaning Drive proved to be a impactful endeavor, aligning with the NSS commitment to community service. The event not only addressed immediate cleanliness concerns but also sowed the seeds for lasting positive changes in the village.

The primary objective of the Soak Pit Construction activity was to address water drainage issues in the village, improve sanitation, and contribute to the overall environmental health of the community. Prior to construction, a thorough assessment was conducted to identify locations with poor drainage. After gathering supplies such as a six-spoon fork, a five-spoon spade, and buckets the volunteers headed to a location This helped in targeting the areas most in need of a soak pit. The soak pit construction aimed to mitigate waterlogging, prevent soil erosion, and improve groundwater recharge, contributing positively to the local ecosystem. The involvement of community members in the construction process promoted a collaborative spirit, strengthening community bonds and encouraging a shared sense of responsibility. The construction of soak pits directly addressed water drainage issues, reducing the risk of waterborne diseases and enhancing overall sanitation in the village.

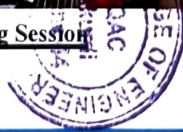

## NSS CAMP DAY: -04

Date:25/01/2024

### ► The following were the objectives of Camp Day 4

- To find a suitable site for dam construction.
- Describe the process of planning and designing dams.
- To find a perfect area for attachment that fulfills the requirements of soil, rainfall, slope, etc.

On Day 4 of the NSS camp, the volunteers woke up at 5.30 a.m. and gathered at the school grounds at 6:30 a.m. Their goals for the day were to locate a good location for the construction of a dam, get knowledge of the planning and designing process of dams, and locate an ideal attachment place that satisfies soil, rainfall, slope, and other requirements.

After gathering supplies such as a ten-spoon fork, a ten-spoon spade, and 10 buckets (5 iron buckets and 5 plastic buckets) and other tools the volunteers headed to a location where powdered rock (Moorum) was available in sufficient quantity. They prepared 455 sacks of murum and bouldersto store 2 lakh liters of water on the upstream side of the canal and transported them to the river location using a tractor. Starting at noon, the volunteers began building the dam by forming three layers of sacks over a length of 14.5 meters width of 1.3m and a height of 0.6 meters. They then added one layer of powdered rocks adjacent to the first layer and prepared anotherlayer of sacks next to that.

At 3:30 p.m., the volunteers returned to the campsite for lunch. Later, past volunteers and coordinators came to visit the dam construction site, providing an opportunity for the volunteers to socialize and build relationships. The day ended with dinner at 9.30 p.m. Overall, it was a productive day for the NSS volunteers, who worked hard on the construction of the dam and took steps toward achieving their objectives. After a long day of hard work, the volunteers gathered around a at the campsite and shared stories of their day, their struggles, and their triumphs. The air was filled with laughter and camaraderie. As they looked up at the starlit sky, they felt a sense of accomplishment. They knew they had not only built a dam but also a strong bond of friendship and teamwork

Then everyone gathered at the school and discussed the next plan. The day ended with a meal, and everyone was settled in their rooms by 11 p.m.

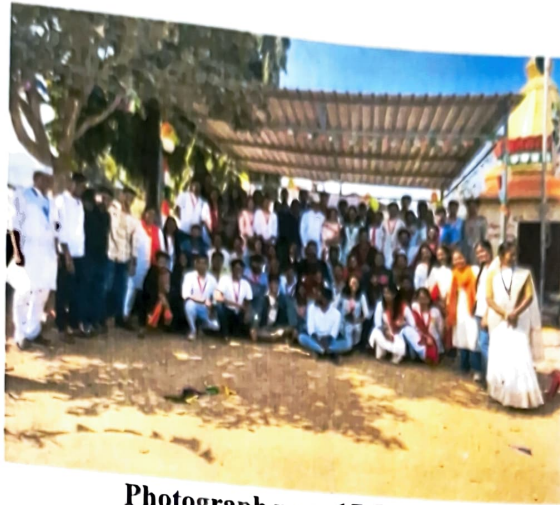

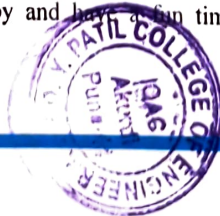
The multi-faceted event aimed to contribute to heritage conservation, promote physical and mental well-being, and engage the community in collaborative activities for both environmental and recreational purposes.

By building the dam, the volunteers contributed to sustainable water management in the area. The dam will help regulate water flow, prevent flooding, and ensure a steady supply of water.

Also Games were conducted for children to enjoy and have fun time with NSS volunteers to connect and make a bond with them

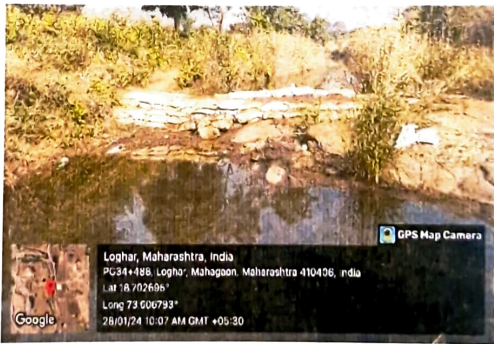
