“NSS Day Celebration and Guest Lecture on Cyber Crime by Expert”

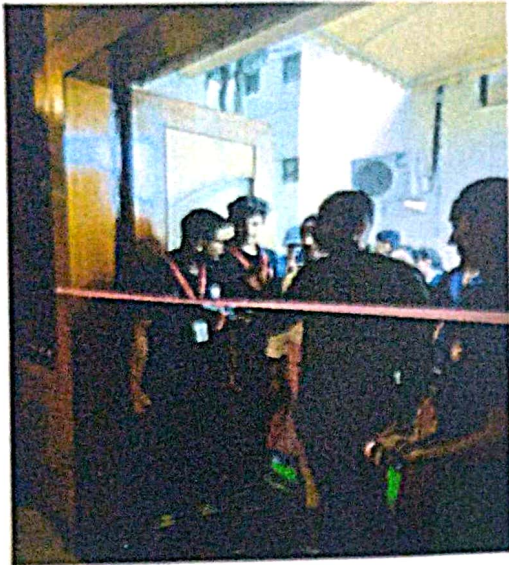
Objective:

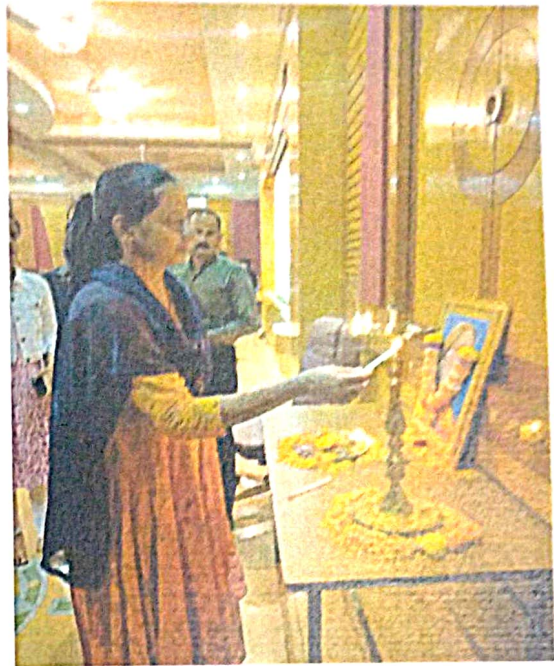




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Outcome Of Activity:

4. **Prevention Strategies:** Students learned about effective prevention measures to protect themselves and their personal information from cyberattacks.




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
